The area is also the starting point for many marine excursions with tours departing from **khor Grama** (Yrama).


Head to Ras Al Jinz to visit the main turtle reserve and witness baby turtles making their way from the sand to the sea at night.












Explore the **ruins of the village** of Tiwi, where you will find the best-preserved tower tombs in the Sultanate of Oman, dating back to between 2000 and 3500 BC. Swim in Wadi Tiwi, which overlooks the Sea of Oman and is characterized by its flowing streams. Many small villages dot the cliffs of this valley.

Meebam village is cool in winter and is known for its pleasant atmosphere in summer, particularly at the popular Wadi Meebam.










Surrounded by towering mountains, the village of **Halam** offers a stunning setting where agricultural terraces and wild trees stretch across the slopes, creating a picturesque landscape. The village's charm is further enhanced by its old houses and traditional neighborhoods, which line the banks of the valley, reflecting the rich cultural heritage of the area.

The village of Al Jeelah serves as a starting point for a fantastic car journey extending nearly 45 kilometers. It is characterized by a pleasant climate in summer and cold temperatures in winter.

Visit Wadi Al Shab, one of the most stunning and beautiful valleys in Oman, where you can embark on an exciting hiking journey through the valley trails.

The ancient city of Qalhat has been inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List due to its stone houses built close to each other, protected by a wall that extends one kilometer, curving towards the sea on its western side. The shrine of **Bibi Maryam**, constructed from coral and limestone and coated with plaster, is adorned with blue glazed tiles and stands as a symbol of beauty and reverence.

Ja'alan Bani Bu Hassan is home to a captivating blend of historical landmarks, timeless villages, ancient mosques, towering mountains, and mysterious caves. Forts, castles, and watchtowers dot the landscape, each with tales from the past.

Begin your journey at the

Ja'alan Bani Bu Hassan Fort,
located just under 1,200
meters southwest of the twin
minarets of the stunning
Al-Farouq Mosque, which
stands proudly along the main
road with a majestic backdrop
of desert and date palms.









Immerse yourself in the calm of **Juwayra**, a coastal village overlooking the Arabian Sea.


In the village of Falaj Al-Mashaykh, you'll find clusters of ghaf trees and palm groves nestled amid golden sands, forming an oasis of life in the desert. Al Ghina Oasis is a serene camping destination and a popular destination to bask in the magic of its desert ambiance and stargaze under its wide, open skies.


For adventure-seekers, Mount **Qahwan** offers mountain sports and the chance to explore hidden caves brimming with secrets.

Take a stroll through Al Hamouda




Relax on the cool sands of Al

enthusiasts.



Take an excursion to Wadi Sal, Wadi Al-Ruwayda, Wadi Abu Fasheega, Wadi Al-Lubaidah, and Wadi Jurayf for a scenic and unforgettable journey.









Al-Kamil and Al-Wafi is a region that is home to scenic dunes, vast golden sands, expansive plains, and picturesque nature reserves, all set against the backdrop of majestic mountain ranges and large, breathtaking springs.

Be sure to visit **Al-Jadeed Fort**, a remarkable blend of historical significance and modern architectural innovation. Built entirely from gypsum, the fort stands as a testament to the craftsmanship of its time, offering a glimpse into the region's rich past.










Explore the rocky formations in **Sibt** village, where Al-Minha Park sits at the top of the village near the main falaj, a perfect spot to unwind. Another gem in Sibt is **Al-Manzaf**, which overlooks the wadi, usually brimming with water. Al-Markha **Park**, with its large water pools, provides an ideal swimming experience, while the wadis like Mazra and Al-Sayq add a sense of natural adventure.

Discover the rich history and scenic beauty of villages like Siq and Tawa, surrounded by vast farms and endless date palms.

The Al-Saleel Nature Reserve encompasses three main geographic types: the vast sedimentary plains adorned with acacia and gum arabic trees, mountain-split valleys, and broad mountainous hills. This sanctuary is a haven for Arabian gazelles, wild cats, Arabian wolves, red foxes, Egyptian vultures, and a wide variety of turtles and birds.














Nestled in the southeastern waters of South Al Sharqiyah, along the Indian Ocean's edge, lies the enchanting Masirah Island—one of Oman's largest islands, with a history dating back over four millennia.







Masirah's shores are a haven for dolphin and whale watching, with sightings of species such as the humpback whale, bottlenose dolphin, and tropical whale.

The island's coastline is also home to over 300 types of coastal birds, including oystercatchers, Egyptian vultures, eagles, gulls, and terns, making Masirah's beaches an exceptional spot to explore marine treasures, as well as activities including kitesurfing and diving.
